Dear Square Dancers,

## DUTY SQUARE AND HOW TO MAKE IT WORK

Those ugly 2 words "Duty Square" need not be so ugly. Setup and cleanup for dancing each week does not have to be a chore and basically requires less than 15 minutes of your time. If each square is organized, each couple should have to commit to no more than 2 nights for the month their square has the duty. Below is an example of how Square $X$, consisting of 10 couples who are currently active (not on LOA), would organize their square so that the chores are fairly shared. This example will show setup and cleanup duty for a month with 5 weeks.

| SETUP | CLEANUP |  |

| $6 / 2$ | Couples $1 \& 2^{*}$ | Couples $3 \& 4$ |
| $6 / 9$ | Couples $3 \& 4$ | Couples $5 \& 6$ |
| $6 / 16$ | Couples $5 \& 6$ | Couples $7 \& 8$ |
| $6 / 23$ | Couples 7 \& 8 | Couples 9 \& 10 |
| $6 / 30$ | Couples $9 \& 10$ | Couples $1 \& 2 * *$ |

* Couples 1 \& 2 would have taken the coffee pot and water jug and supplies home the prior week (5/26) and returned them on $6 / 2$.
** Couples from the next month's Duty Square would take home the coffee pot, water jug and supplies. Couples $1 \& 2$ would only sweep up, put away chairs and help Ken.

The Square Head for each square should be able to organize this with a few phone calls to the people in their square. Everyone is expected to do their share and should be willing to commit to 2 nights a month, no more than twice a year, in order for this to go smoothly. In the past the names of the people in the duty square for that month has been posted on the bulletin board. We will be doing that again just as a reminder to folks as to when they have the duty. It will be up to the square head to organize his/her square in the above manner or, if they feel they have a better plan, to organize that plan. The important thing here is that it needs to be organized. Without any planning, the job does not get done or it gets done by the same people all the time. Some people may have some conflicts that prevent them from helping out during their duty month. In this case, it is their responsibility to find someone else they can trade months with. Some people may have a last minute conflict on their duty night. It is still their responsibility and must find someone to fill in for them. If someone isn't willing to commits 2 nights a month, no more than twice a year to the Duty Square, maybe they should look for another club or activity that doesn't ask so much of them.
I hope this will help everyone involved and make the Rafter Rockers a much more enjoyable club to be a part of. If anyone has any ideas or other solutions please feel free to share them with me. I am always looking for ways to make things easier. Thanks for everyones help and cooperation and happy dancing to everyone.

## DUTY SQUARE

Responsibilites of the duty square are as follows:

## For Setup:

1. Returning coffee pot, water jug and supplies if taken last week. Water jug should have ice.
2. Filling coffee pot with hot water and water jug with cold water. Putting out coffee supplies and cups.
3. Setting up chairs if not already done or setting up more if necessary.

For Cleanup:

1. Picking up cups, cleaning kitchen, emptying water jug and coffee pot, packing supplies.
2. Putting away chairs, sweeping floor. and helping Ken with his equipment.
3. One couple should take a coffee pot and water jug and supplies home to be returned the following week. Since there is 2 of everything, two couples are needed for this job.
4. Ken may also ask for help in turning out the lights and locking the doors.
